In June, we sent 14 PETs to Global Aid Network for distribution. 20 more were sent to MedWish in October. These organizations partner with us and handle overseas shipping and distribution.

We have incorporated as PET MI-Saline and are in the process of becoming a 501c3 non-profit, tax exempt charity. This allows us to fundraise and provide donors with a tax deduction. Uzbekistan

The following is an excerpt of a report from a volunteer part maker who went on a PET distribution in Uzbekistan in April 2006.

This Uzbek man had been recruited into the Russian Army when the Russians ran the country prior to the collapse of the USSR. His name is Hobibullo, which he says means "last slave of God". He was sent to fight in Afghanistan. While there he was caught in an explosion and lost both legs above the knees. This was 22 years ago. He came in riding on a glorified skate board. It was a small platform complete with a seat belt and small wheels and he had a couple handles with rubber bases that he used to pull himself around to protect his hands.

PET History – the beginning

In 1995, Reverend Larry Hills, missionary in Zaire (now Congo), Africa, told Reverend Mel West of the great need for three-wheeled, hand -cranked wheelchairs for victims of polio and landmines. Mel contacted Earl Miner, product designer and long-time friend and mission partner; and the process of the prototype design Mel began began. making PETs in his garage, and now 24 Affiliate locations produce PETs. Over 40,000 PETs have been distributed to people in 100 countries.

How PETs are distributed

The units are donated to partnering field orals who handle the importation costs, assessment of beneficiaries, and the distribution of the carts to the disabled. There is no expense to the distribution partner for the carts themselves, they are gladly donated. Following the distribution, the partner is asked to supply a report with photographs regarding the outcomes of the pro-

PETs go to 100 Countries

We ship completed PETS by motor freight to partners such as Global Aid Network, MedWish, and others. Our partners have distribution networks all over the world.

We don't always know where the PETs we've made go. Some have gone to Kenya, Haiti, Zimbabwe, and Peru.

Wherever our PETs go, they will help people gain mobility, enabling trips to earn a living, go to school, to market, to church, and to get up out of the dirt they crawl in.

P.E.T.s help in Zimbabwe

George Bhobho, 10, from Zengeza, a high-density suburb in Chitungwiza, Zimbabwe, lost both parents to AIDS not more than 2 years ago. He's now under the care of his grandmother. He has arthrogryphosis, a rare congenital disorder that is characterized by multiple joint contractures and can include muscle weakness and fibrosis. It is a non-progressive disease. He is one of the beneficiaries of the PET carts, which will help him greatly in his mobility.
