A CLAY COUNTY CELEBRATION

The Paul and Klare Reinhold Foundation granted a monetary gift to us at their April 2017 annual awards breakfast. This was a gala celebration for a variety of Clay County, Florida, not-for-profit agencies! Since 2003, our organization has received numerous awards, including the top dollar award and the volunteer of the year award for Larry Hills. We are blessed to be a recipient of a Clay County foundation that supports on-going agencies and encourages new nonprofits to meet county needs.

CARTS FOR KENYANS

People of all ages living in Kenya are benefitting from mobility carts shipped there by MedShare and distributed by Partners for Care. This agency is a non-governmental organization helping to ease the people's burdens, including those with disabilities. In 2016 alone, 185 mobility carts from Penney Farms were paired with recipients through these two partners.

Recently, the president and founder of Partners for Care, Connie Cheren, spoke at Penney Farms and shared many stories of Kenyan lives transformed because of the provision of mobility. She pointed out that 4.6% of Kenyans experience some form of disability, and only one in six disabled children attend school. Those who do are often ostracized and face exclusion.

A KENYAN STORY WITH A HAPPY ENDING

Ephemera grew up in western Kenya enjoying school, social activities, and sports. Sidelined by polio at 18, her life changed dramatically. Her legs were useless; her old life was gone and with it, her freedom and independence. She was dependent on her caregivers for mobility. Friends melted away and Ephemera withdrew into herself. Attending school was a huge challenge for the family. If Ephemera was to attend at all, her mother had to carry her there. Ephemera wasn't sure she even wanted to go.

Change came for the whole family when Ephemera received her own PET through Partners for Care, and her mother was freed from carrying her daughter. Ephemera described it as an answer to her prayers. The cart gave her the freedom she had been longing for. Ephemera, now 28 years old, has renewed hope in becoming

a teacher. Carts come with a huge supply of happy endings.

Crown Products, located in Jacksonville, Florida, makes air ducting for the HVAC industry. For us at Mobility Worldwide—FL, they make the upper and lower chain and sprocket guards for our PETs. These are guards that keep fingers from getting pinched while protecting the chain. As needed during the year, Crown Products donates 500 units of each guard, which are made to fit both sizes of our mobility carts.

This partnership began when Larry Hills was just beginning PET production at Penney Farms. He met with the CEO of Crown, explaining the purpose and mission of PETs.

Tampa Bay Steel Corporation

Tampa Bay Steel in Tampa, Florida, has been donating raw steel cut to length as well as two laser-cut pieces to PET–FL since 2001. They deliver each shipment to Penney Farms on Tampa Bay trucks.
