Brezo, Romania — The following email was received on June 12, 2014. It was written by a priest who received 2 PET carts made by our shop.

"Hello, My name is Daniel. I'm priest in a small community in Romania. Today I make a great surprise for 2 person because off youbecause I take 2 PET from a organization and I make happy 2 persons. They was very happy and I want to feel you the same....for that I send some foto. Daniel Serban"

Word spread quickly when the PET Shop opened up that morning and volunteers gathered around the com-

puter monitor to see pictures of some of our PETs given to their new owners! Some had to check our map to find out exactly where Romania is located (eastern Europe).

"This is Payday!" and "This is what it is all about!" exclaimed several of the volunteers as they headed back to their work stations with new purpose and great satisfaction.

Upon closer inspection of the 2 pictures, it was determined that the cart with the man seated on it was actually put together incorrectly and this could result in the top box board cracking since the side seatback

boards were not bolted into both the top and bottom box side panels (see arrow).

With the help of a Romanian friend here in the States, a message was sent back to Daniel to immediately correct this problem. Two days later Daniel emailed back saying he had made the proper changes and that he would get us pictures of both PET carts put together properly.

- the cart on the right is not completely assembled
- it has a serial number of DM0342 (see arrow) which means it was made here in

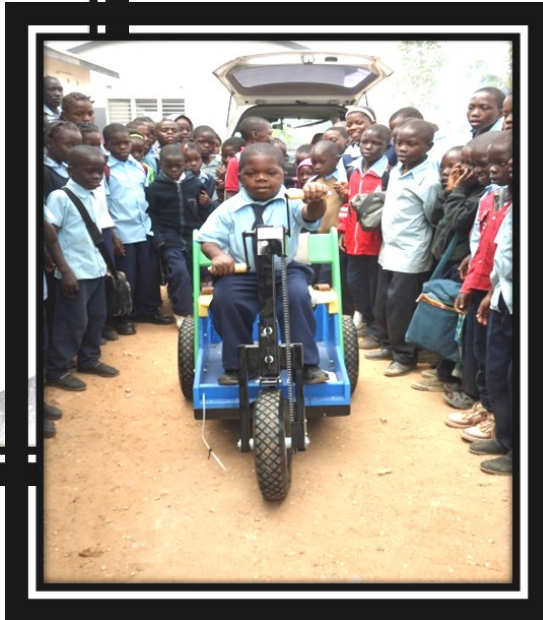
