Mobility Worldwide is working with Pathways to Hope Africa, in providing 275 child carts going to Uganda. These carts will be leaving Mobility Worldwide West Michigan on December 2, 2024. What a wonderful time of year for these kids to receive this gift of Mobility in their lives. We are delighted to be working with this organization to help in this way. We reached out to Tabitha Kyambade and she shared the following information regarding the Pathways to Hope Africa organization:

Pathways to Hope Africa was founded out of a deep commitment to break cycles of generational poverty and restore dignity across East and Central Africa. Inspired by my experiences witnessing both the challenges and the immense potential of African communities striving for better education, healthcare, and economic opportunities, I recognized the need for sustainable, community-driven solutions that empower individuals and build resilient communities. While there are incredible untapped resources within these



communities, many grassroots organizations lack the support, training, and infrastructure needed to make a long-lasting impact. By establishing Pathways to Hope Africa, we aim to bridge these gaps through capacity-building, resource mobilization, and strategic partnerships, enabling sustainable and community-driven change.

Pathways to Hope Africa is dedicated to empowering communities through education by offering an extensive range of resources and tools that directly support effective learning. We provide essential teaching supplies, modern technology, and carefully curated curriculum resources that align with local educational standards, ensuring that both students and teachers have what they need to succeed. In addition to basic school supplies, we equip classrooms with digital tools, including tablets, computers, and, where available, internet access.

I first learned about Mobility Worldwide West Michigan and your mission to help children and small adults who lack the use of their legs at the Global Mission and Tech meeting. Hearing about your dedication to providing mobility solutions to those in need deeply resonated with me, especially considering the life-changing impact mobility can have on individuals and communities. Mobility carts for children are designed to greatly enhance independence and quality of life for those without the use of their legs. activities, which fosters personal development. At home, the carts support daily mobility, allowing children to move independently, contribute to household tasks, and lessen their reliance on caregivers. GREETINGS FRIENDS AND MISSION PARTNERS,

As 2024 comes to a close, I am happy to report that we have had a very productive and fulfilling year. We are on track to produce over 700 mobility carts for the year by the end of December. We have had a few challenges with getting components and supplies but have managed with the help of our very talented and resourceful team to find several new suppliers. We are constantly working to improve the quality of our carts through the wonderful talents and efforts of our team members, to make them more durable and easier to maintain by our users in many remote locations.

In June we produced our 7,000th cart since starting production in 2009. We celebrated this milestone by having an open house on Saturday, October 12th. We were blessed with good weather and many guests came to visit our new shop. We were visited by several of our suppliers, mission partners, and many donors and volunteers. It was a wonderful time to show how well our new shop has improved our productivity and efficiency.

Two of our board members, Dale Dykema and Joel Wolfe, were able to attend the annual Mobility International Conference in September and were able to form a partnership with a mission group from Minnesota, Pathways to Hope Africa, who provide medical supplies and a number of adult carts to many communities throughout Africa. They drove from Minneapolis to visit our shop open-house and were so impressed with our carts that they committed to paying the shipping cost for a full forty-foot container of 275 small carts to be shipped to Uganda. These carts are being loaded by our team of volunteers on December 2nd and should arrive sometime in early 2025.

I can't emphasize enough the importance of the faithful gifts we receive from our many donors throughout the year. This is the only way for us to fulfill our very important mission of providing mobility to children who are handicapped and living in countries that don't have the resources to provide for them. As Jo Bird, one of our board members, wrote: "YOU are the generous power that allows us to produce and ship rugged self-propelled Mobility Carts abroad. Our carts offer life itself to boys and girls hoping to attend school, learn a trade, work, make friends and attend church."
