# His Wheels International's Fact Sheet 2005-2025 20 Years of an Amazing Ride

It all happened after a dinner invitation by Walt and Ellen in 2003. Alice Teisan asked John and Carolyn Lutembeka, from Tanzania, "How can our church help your ministry in Tanzania?" After only a moment's hesitation, John replied, If every family in the church gave a \$100gift, each gift would purchase a new bicycle. It would allow a traveling evangelist or healthcare/AIDS worker to reach more villages faster given the distance between villages is often a six-hour-walk.

In May, 2005, with the encouragement of the late Robert Walker, His Wheels International was incorporated as a 501-C-3 Not-For-Profit. Walker, "The Pioneer of Christian Journalism" prayed daily for Teisan (12 years), taught her to write, challenged her to write a tract, a book, and start a ministry.

By July 2005, a picture sparked our Global Hand-cycle (trike) Division. Globally, many have been impacted by polio, landmines, and other physical disabilities. Without transportation, these individuals are left crawling along on their hands, pulling their paralyzed limbs behind through the dirt and sewage.

An invitation to a party (August 2005), is where Teisan and Kevin Nikolich met. After showing him a picture of a hand-cycle Teisan bought in Nigeria, Africa in 2003 (part of her lifetime goal: to give away 100-bicycles). Teisan said, "I hope to take a welding class, learn to weld and then build hand-cycles." Kevin said, "I'm a mechanical engineer. Can I design, build and pay for the trike prototype?

From there, it was clear that this was divine timing and His Wheels started rolling.
