People with disabilities around the world can face insurmountable challenges when it comes to accessing their communities, building relationships, and living with confidence and high self-worth. This is only exacerbated when public services, like healthcare, are unable to provide basic services and social structures create intense levels of exclusion driven by stigma. Narratives reinforce these social barriers by focusing on the inability of people, lack of potential, and the idea that there is no hope for people that live their life with differing physical and mental means.

At Mobility Worldwide, we are actively working to flip this narrative by highlighting the ability of all people regardless of their circumstance. Over the course of generations, significant advances have been made that enable people with disabilities to experience healthy and active lives through forms of both simple and basic technology. For the past three decades, Mobility Worldwide has been doing its part by distributing more than 110,000 Mobility Carts around the globe to help people connect with their community, access employment opportunities, reclaim their dignity, and play their role in eliminating stigma associated with disability.

I deeply believe that every human being should have the ability to access anything that helps them reach their full potential. Whether it be education, career growth, family building, travel, or simply feeling as though dreams are achievable, every single person of every ability has the right to access. We are doing our part by helping people access more of the world around them through the power of mobility and build connections through the strength of community.




## INCOME REPORT

# JoAnn Shore Fund for Servant Leadership



This year marked the official launch of the JoAnn Shore Young Leader Scholarship Fund (JAS Fund), created to honor JoAnn Shore's legacy of compassion and service. The fund empowers young leaders to witness the life-changing impact of mobility firsthand through international distribution trips.

Our first JAS scholars, Leena and Leila, traveled to Kenya to help deliver Mobility Carts alongside Partners for Care and connect with local recipients.

Through their experience, they not only saw the impact each Mobility Cart can make but also furthered their understanding and appreciation of service and community.

# Community Highlight

A container of Mobility Carts that was sent to Malawi in 2024 arrived in Tanzania in June and caught fire shortly after crossing the Malawi border. All carts and donating sewing machines were destroyed.

MW Austin and generous donors organized to get a replacement container loaded and shipped by the end of July 2024. The container held 183 mobility carts, 6 sewing machines, 6 boxes of clothes, 5 boxes of children's books, and 2 bags of dolls.

The container arrived in November 2024 and all Mobility Carts were distributed through our partner, Somebody Cares Ministries, in Malawi.

Macloud Baxton, 31, has faced many challenges due to mobility issues, making travel to church and other places a struggle. Born healthy, he was left paralyzed after suffering from cerebral malaria, which caused permanent brain damage. Although his parents enrolled him in school, they eventually couldn't manage to take him anymore, and he had to leave. However, he found purpose in collecting and repairing bicycles.

Everything changed when Somebody Cares Ministries provided him with a Mobility Cart. With it, Macloud can now travel long distances and attend church regularly. He has even turned the cart into a mobile bike repair garage, serving his community and earning an income.


# 30th Anniversary Gala
