John Rotich

John Rotich lives in Konin Village in Bomet County, 138 miles from Nairobi. John developed polio at an early age and has been crawling on the ground all 55 years of his life. He was never able to attend school but is a trained cobbler. After seeing the arrival of a container filled with mobility carts on PFC's social media, friends from John's village sent a message with his photo to their Mobility Carts Program Director, Mary. Days later, PFC was there to help, and John rose from the dust for the first time. Sitting in his new mobility cart cried, "God has remembered me; my knees and hands will no longer hurt. I have legs now!"



Mr. Mutai, a village elder, said, "I can sleep a happy man now that John has a mobility cart. God bless all involved in lifting our people. John will go to church tomorrow and have a front seat!" John is so excited to take himself to church and to start a cobbler service in his village to feed his own family. The gift of mobility has truly transformed his life!
